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ABOUT THE PROJECT

EUpTrain - Transnational knowledge exchange between trainers of low-skilled adults in multiple European countries (project number 2020-1-AT01-KA204-077961) is funded by the European Commission through the Erasmus+ programme (KA2, strategic partnership for adult education) and it aims to create a transnational network between organisations specialised in adult education through exchange of experts and the development of a sustainable handbook comprising transnational good practices and methods for trainers working with low-skilled adults.

OBJECTIVES

- to establish a transnational network of organisations between Austria, Hungary, Bulgaria, Italy, Portugal, Greece and Romania
- share Europe-wide knowledge between organisations specialised in adult education through exchange of experts
- develop a sustainable handbook comprising transnational good practices and methods for trainers working with low-skilled adults

ACTIVITIES

- 3 transnational project meetings attended by a total of 16 experts (8 trainers and 8 project managers)
- participation in one Knowledge Exchange Workshop to share examples of good practices, international differences, new opportunities, new ways of working, and new methods in the training of low-skilled adults.
- collaborate in the production of a handbook containing the results of the knowledge exchange activities.

RESULTS

- a needs assessment of participating organisations regarding adult education in terms of personnel development.
- a handbook (translated into 8 languages) containing the results of knowledge-exchange activities, specifically a collection of concrete examples of international best practice examples and methodologies for trainers working with low-skilled adults.
